

**Minutes**  
**Union County Historic Preservation Commission**  
**September 1, 2009**

The Union County Historic Preservation Commission met at 3:30 on Tuesday, September 1, 2009 in the Heritage Room at the historic Union County Courthouse, Monroe, North Carolina.

Due to lack of a quorum, no business was conducted. Mrs. Bjorlin made several announcements.

1. Concerning expiration of member's terms:
  - John Dickerson, appointed by the City of Monroe, term expires in October, '09.
  - Danny Stegall, appointed by the City of Monroe to fill Sis Dillon's unexpired term, has filed application for appointment.
  - Emmy Lou Haywood, appointed by Waxhaw, term expires September, '09. Waxhaw has established a Historic Preservation Commission; therefore, a Representative will no longer serve on the Union County Historic Preservation Commission.
  
2. Courtney Richie, Union County Legal Department, has advised that Marshville Town Council has zoning power and should designate the Hamilton-Marsh House, 1311 Highway 205, Marshville, North Carolina, owned by Mr. and Mrs. William Potter. A packet has been delivered to the Attorney for Marshville, Bobby Griffin. The report will be reviewed by the Marshville Planning Board, and the Marshville Town Council before a public hearing is scheduled.
  
3. In response to Mrs. Funderburk's inquiry about the status of the Survey and Research Report for designation of the Stallings Methodist Church, Mrs. Bjorlin said that Mr. Sidney Halma is doing more research to compile the report.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 6, 2009.
