Election Information for Nov. 6 General Election

September 5, 2012 – Monroe, NC - A General Election will be held on Nov. 6 in Union County for voting on federal, state, county, judicial, board of education and soil and water conservation supervisor. Polls will be open from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m.

Absentee by mail ballots are allowed. Requests for an absentee by mail ballot must be made in writing and received in the Union County Board of Elections office by 5 p.m. on Oct. 30. Absentee by mail voting ends at 5 p.m. on Nov. 5.

One-stop voting will be held in the Griffin Room located at 316 East Windsor St at the Union County Public Library beginning Thursday, Oct. 18 and ending Saturday, Nov. 3. One-stop voting hours are Monday - Friday from 8:30 a.m. - 6 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. One-stop voting will be open for one Sunday **only** on Oct. 21 from 1 p.m. - 5 p.m.

There will be four satellite locations for voters' convenience. These sites will be open Monday – Friday from 10 a.m. – 6 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. Satellite locations will be open for one Sunday **only** on Oct. 21 from 1 p.m. - 5 p.m. The satellite locations are:

- Stallings VFD located at 4616 Old Monroe Rd. in Indian Trail
- Hemby Bridge VFD located at 6628 Mill Grove Rd in Hemby Bridge
- Wesley Chapel VFD located at 8821 New Town Rd in Marvin
- Wingate Community Center located at 315 W. Elm St. in Wingate.

Persons wishing to register and vote after the registration deadline may appear in person at a one-stop voting site, complete the voter registration application form and provide proof of residence by presenting valid documents showing current name and address.

All residents of Union County who are registered to vote with the Union County Board of Elections may vote in this election. Voters who are previously registered need not re-register for this election. Those residents who are not registered to vote must register on or before Oct. 12 in order to be eligible to vote on Election Day. Any voter who has moved since the last election must notify the Board of Elections in writing by Oct. 12. Persons who will be 18 by the General Election may register and vote in this election. Voter Registration Forms are available at the Board of Elections Office at 316 B East Windsor St, all Union County Public Libraries, town

halls, and a form is available on the Union County Board of Elections website at www.co.union.nc.us Forms should be mailed to Union County Board of Elections at P.O. Box 1106 Monroe NC 28112.
