The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court-involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2018-2019** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2018**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

**The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:**

*Sex Offender Evaluation & Treatment	*Family Counseling	
*Psychological/Clinical Assessments	*Parent/Family Skill Building Programs	*Vocational Development
*Substance Abuse Counseling	*Interpersonal Skill Building Programs	*Tutoring/Academic Enhancement
*Restitution/Community Service	*Temporary Shelter Care	*Mentoring

**Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:**

\* Substance Use/Abuse   \*School Behavioral Problems   \* Parent/Guardian/Custodian who has difficulty providing adequate supervision   \*Juveniles who associate with other delinquent youth

**Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:**

Peer Domain:            Union County youth involved with juvenile justice system are more likely to associate with others who are involved in delinquent/criminal activity.

Individual Domain:    Juveniles involved in the Union County juvenile justice system have a higher rate than state average of some substance use, that needs further assessment.

Family Domain:        Parental Support and/or parental enhancement skills needed for juvenile court referred youth. **Access to services that provide best practices and have ability to engage families are needed.**

School Domain:        Youth involved with the Union County juvenile justice system have an increased risk of school behavior issues reflected in long-term suspensions and unexcused absences.

**Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:**

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

**Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.**
